What could go wrong? What hazard have you identified? What are the risks from it?	Who is at risk?	What are you going to do about it? How are the risks already controlled? What extra controls are needed? How will they be communicated to young people and adults and remain inclusive to all needs?	Review & revise What has changed that needs to be thought about and controlled?
There is a risk of injury in the event of a fire as the Fire Door can be locked on the inside while the building is occupied.	All Users	-Leaders are briefed and Users are advised to keep the door unlocked when the room is occupied. The only exception is when the bouldering activity is in use as this requires the door to be bolted. -Warning sign are in place	.
In the event of a power cut there is a risk of trips and falls due to limited natural light	All Users	-Emergency exit lights are in place and switch on automatically in the event of a power cut.	
Risk of trips or falls on the main entrance steps	All Users	-Outside lighting illuminates the steps at night -Warning sign in place to use handrail and avoid trips	
Risk of trips and falls due to wet floor	All Users	-All Users are requested to remove shoes	
Risk of fall and injury	All Users	-All bouldering activities must be supervised and participants supported with 'spotters' -Rubber matting covers the whole floor to reduce injury in the event of a fall	
Risk of bumps	All Users	-All activity to be supervised	

Don't forget, as part of your programme planning, you should have contingency activities in reserve just in case you can't do what was planned or you need to stop half way through. Make sure this is shared with those involved, so everyone knows how to respond. You should have risk assessed contingency activities prior to them taking place and communicated key information to those involved as with all activities.
